Both degrees prepare students for a future in music, which may include graduate study.

### CURRICULUM

A variety of courses help students develop a strong base in music theory, music history and musicianship. Students receive individual instruction in applied music (voice, piano, organ, guitar, electric bass, strings, woodwind, brass and percussion). Opportunities exist to develop ensemble skills by performing with concert choir, gospel choir, concert band, jazz ensemble, pep band, praise band, handbell choir, guitar ensemble and chamber music ensembles.

Students learn by doing through cross disciplinary and collaborative studies related to the arts and community building. They gain hands-on experience in creating small collaborative performances.

Each student designs a senior year capstone experience in collaboration with a faculty supervisor (or supervisors in the case of an interdisciplinary project). The capstone experience may be a creative project, internship or community project.

### step 3 SUBMIT TEST SCORES (optional)

Submit official ACT or SAT test scores.

### step 4 DECISION

Once all admissions materials are received, your Admissions Counselor will contact you with an acceptance decision.
