APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Completed Pfeiffer University application for admission and application fee; available at www.pfeiffer.eas; SAT or ACT scores

To qualify to apply to the M.S. in Elementary Education program (3-2 Program in Elementary Education) during the student teaching semester, undergraduate students must:

- Complete all required undergraduate coursework in Elementary Education (141 semester hours)
- Earn a grade of C or better in each education (EDUC) and (SPED) course as well as HPED 401, BIOL 211, 212, CHEM 201, ENGL 101, 102, MATH 210, 211, or higher level course
- Complete cultural credits prior to student teaching semester
- Complete an e-portfolio demonstrating mastery of State of North Carolina standards for teacher candidates
- Pass licensure examinations required by the NC Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI) for elementary teacher candidates
