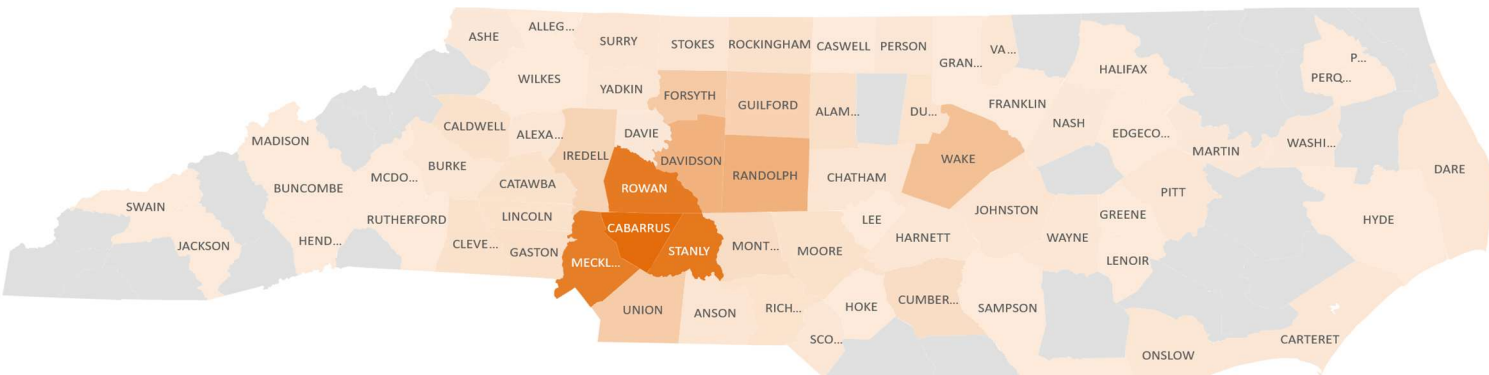

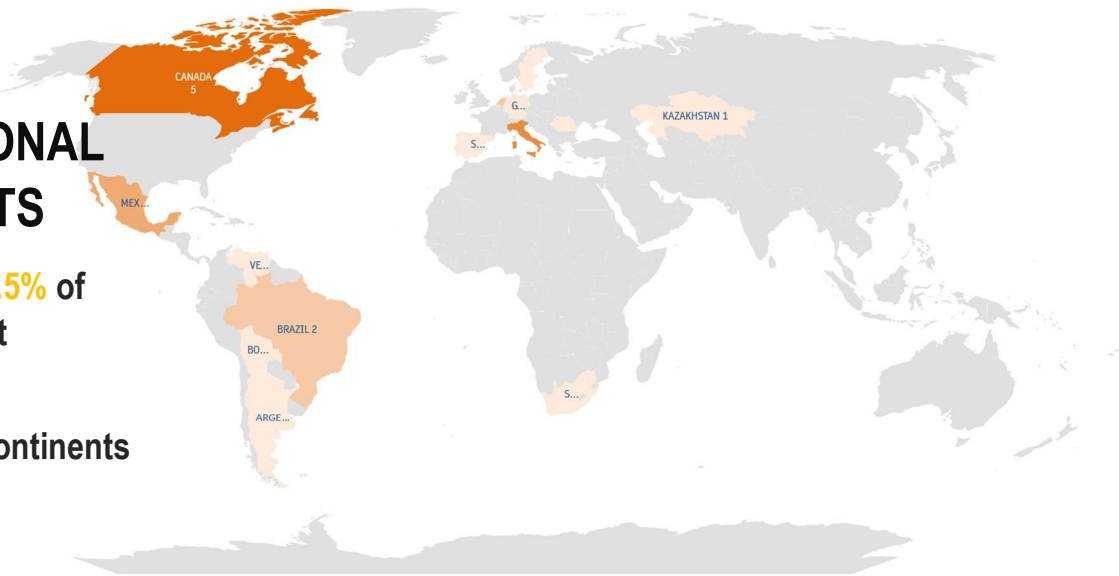

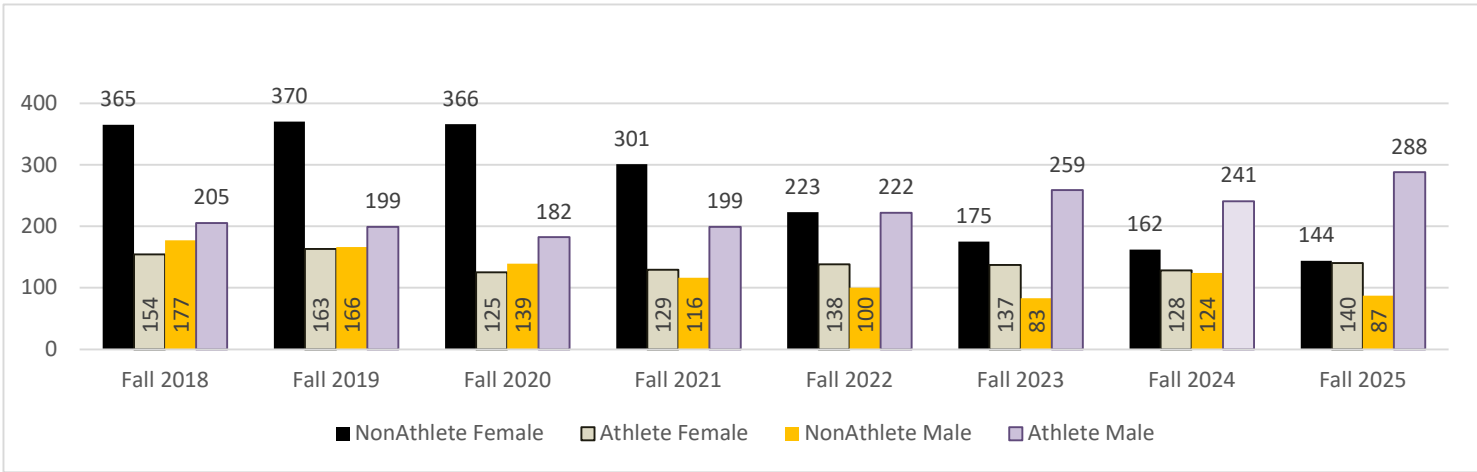
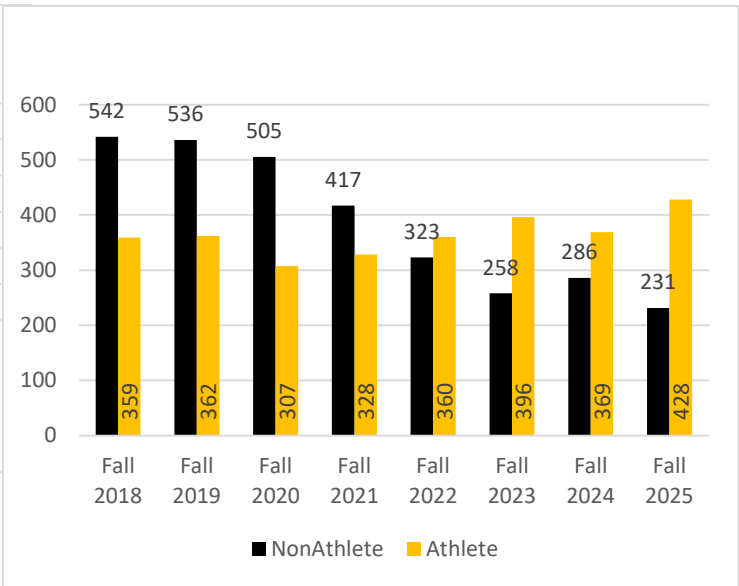
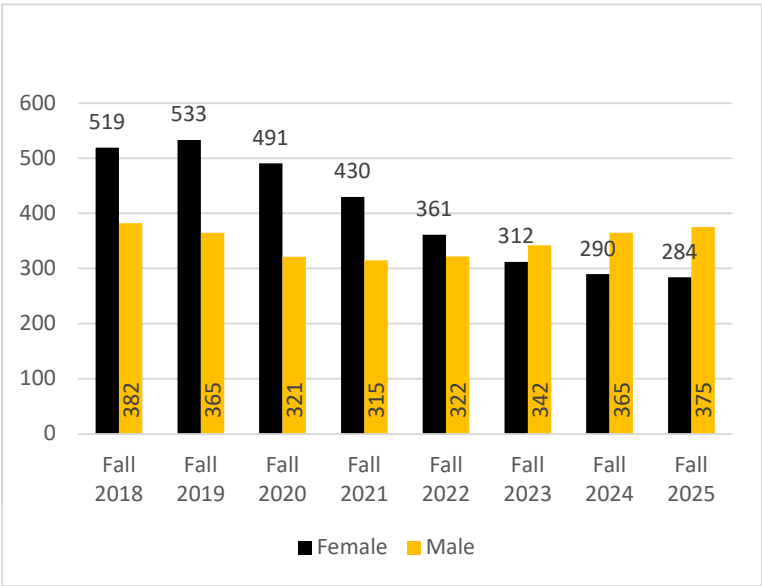
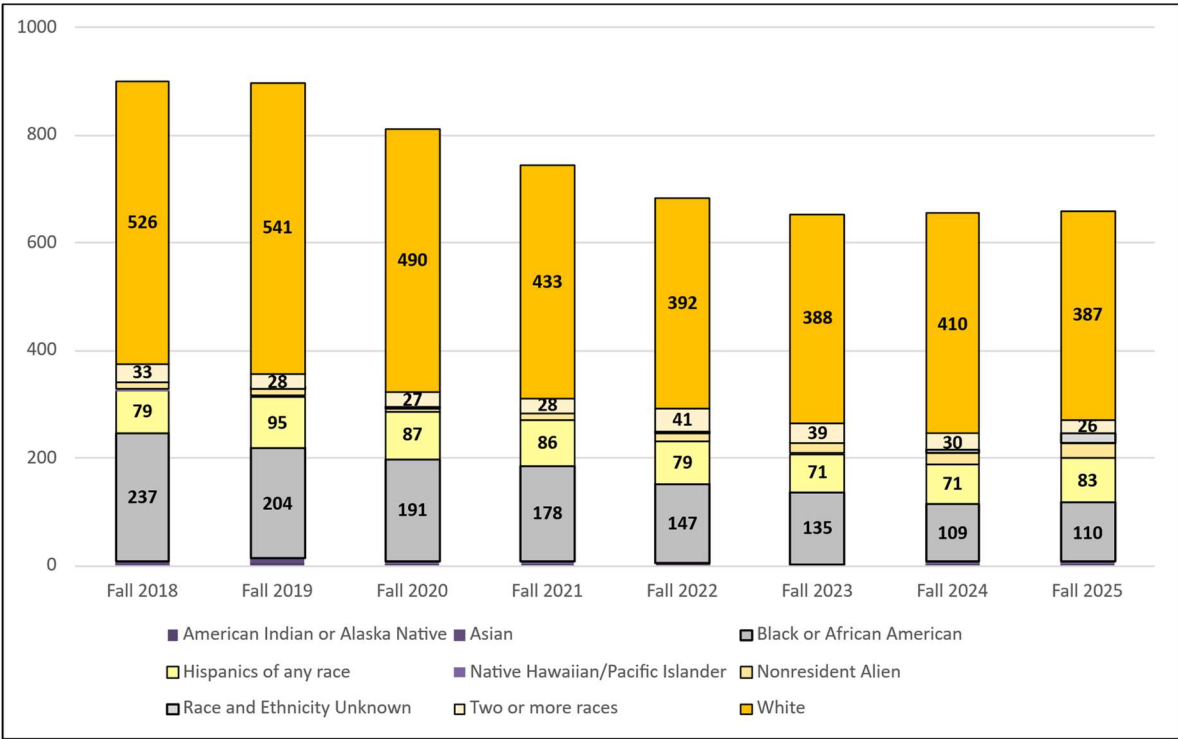


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# Student Demographics – Fall 2025 Race and Ethnicity (FT & PT)



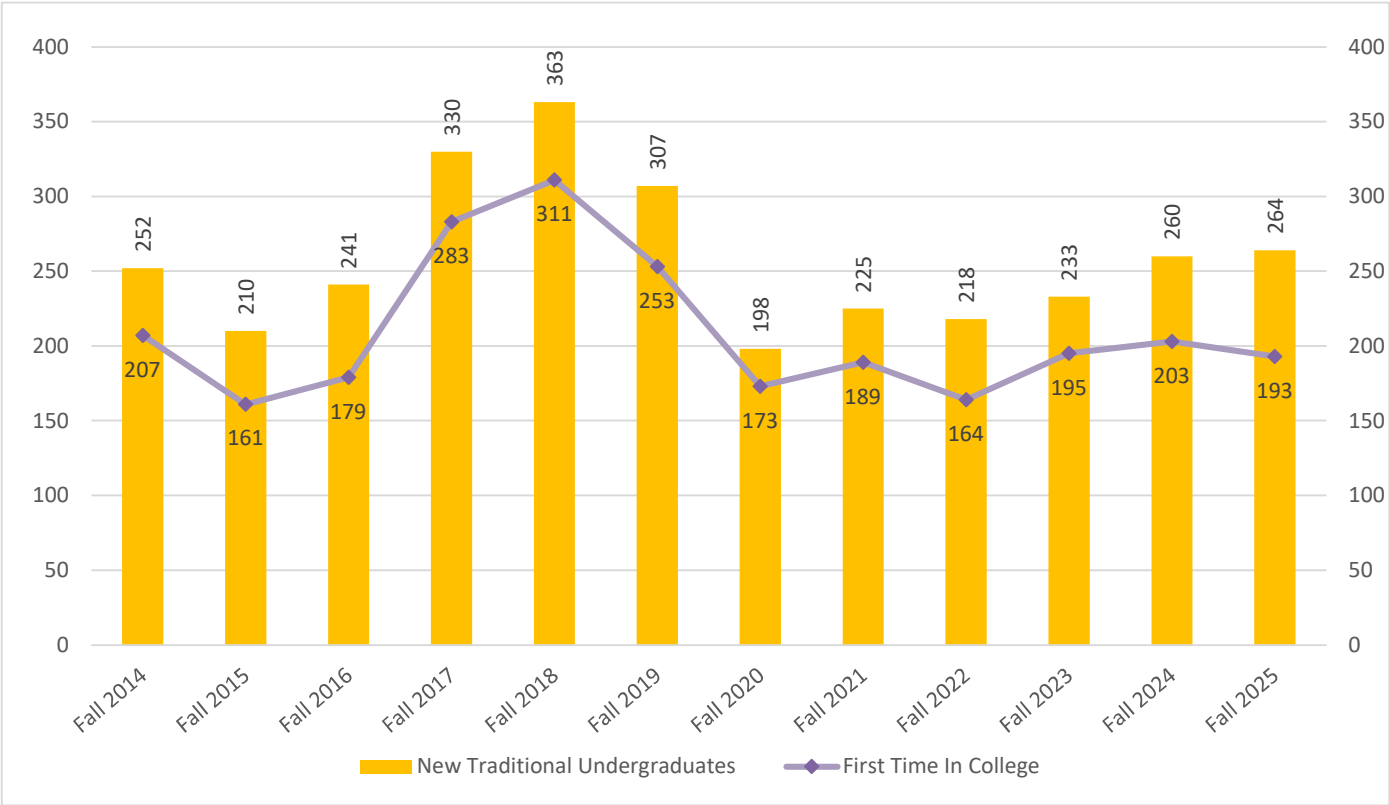
# Student Demographics –Undergraduate Trends- Full Time Students

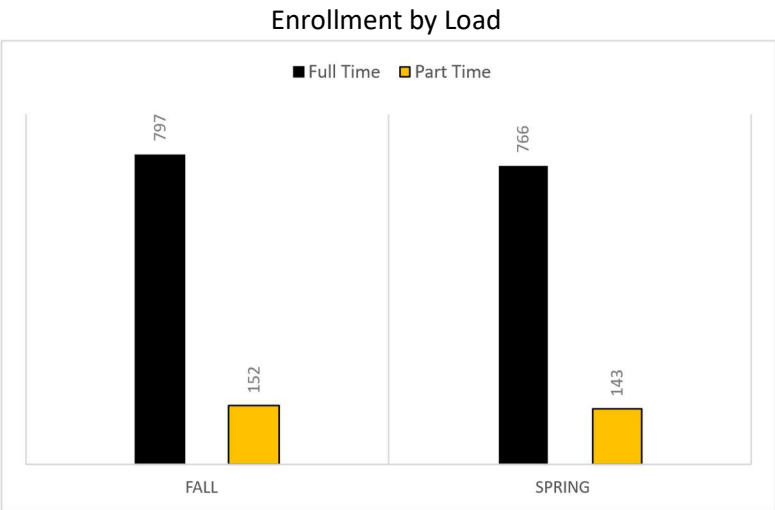
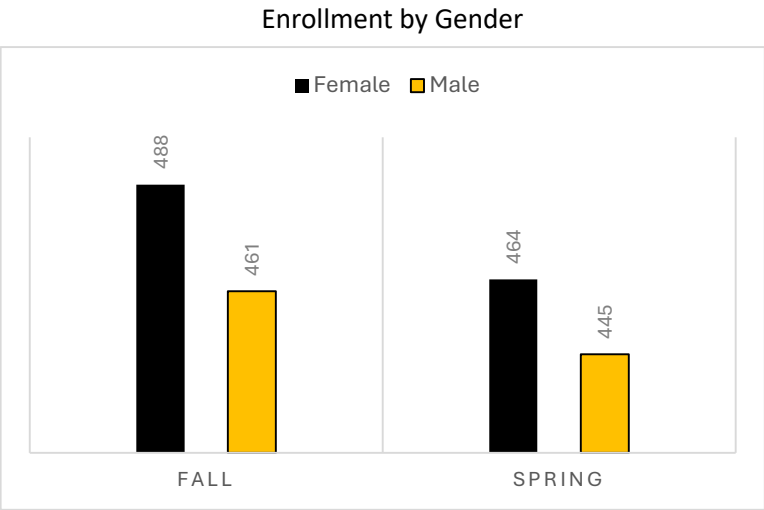
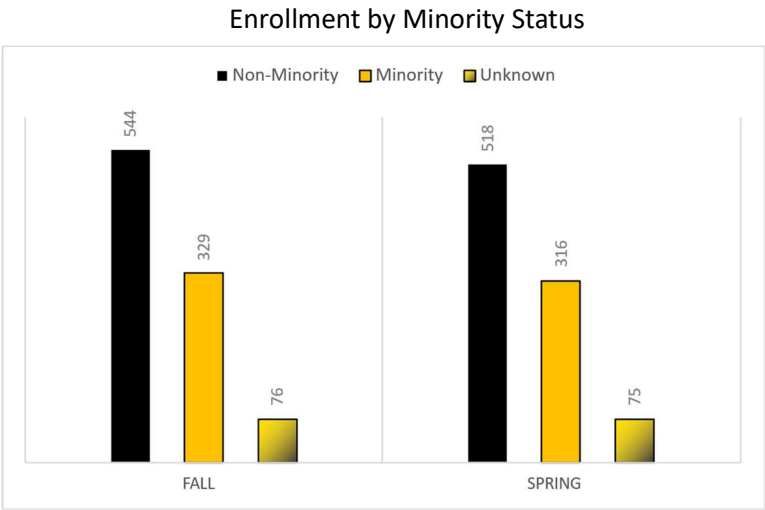
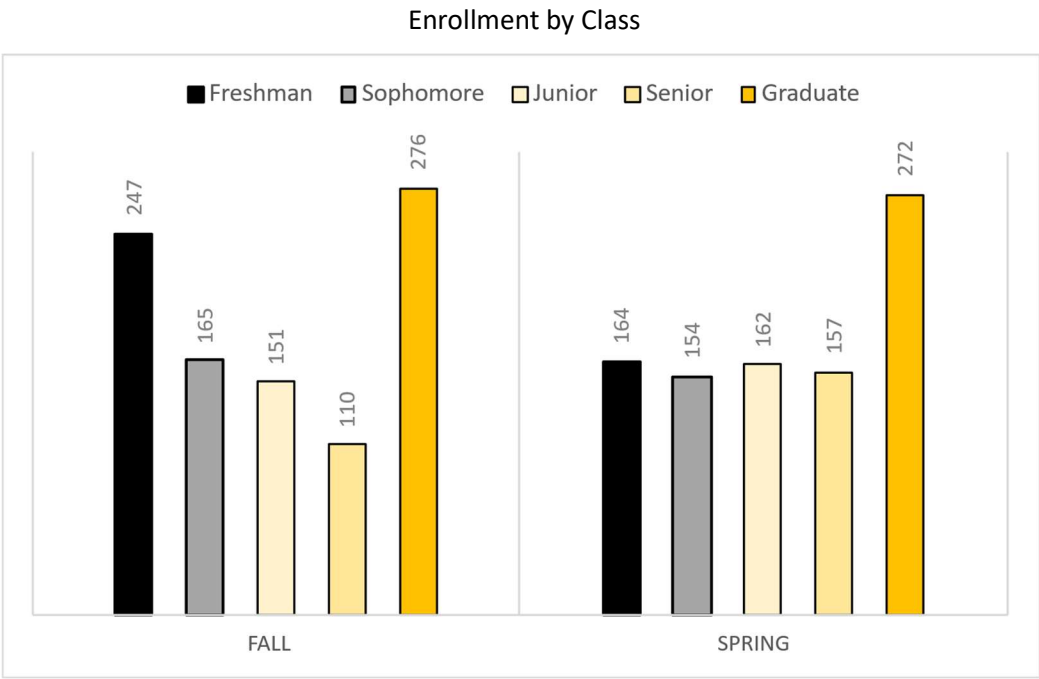
## First Time in College and Transfer Students - Traditional Undergraduates

Fall Term Full Time



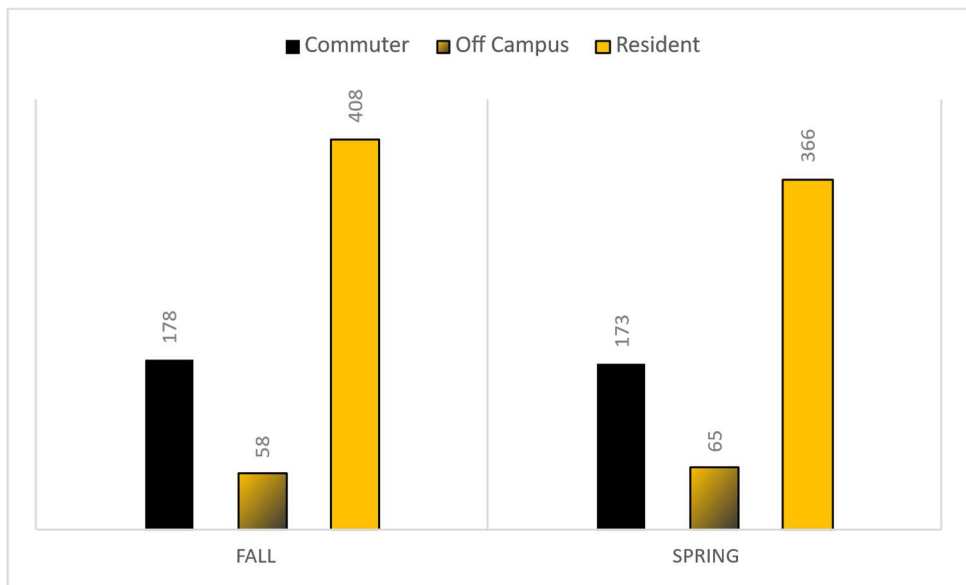
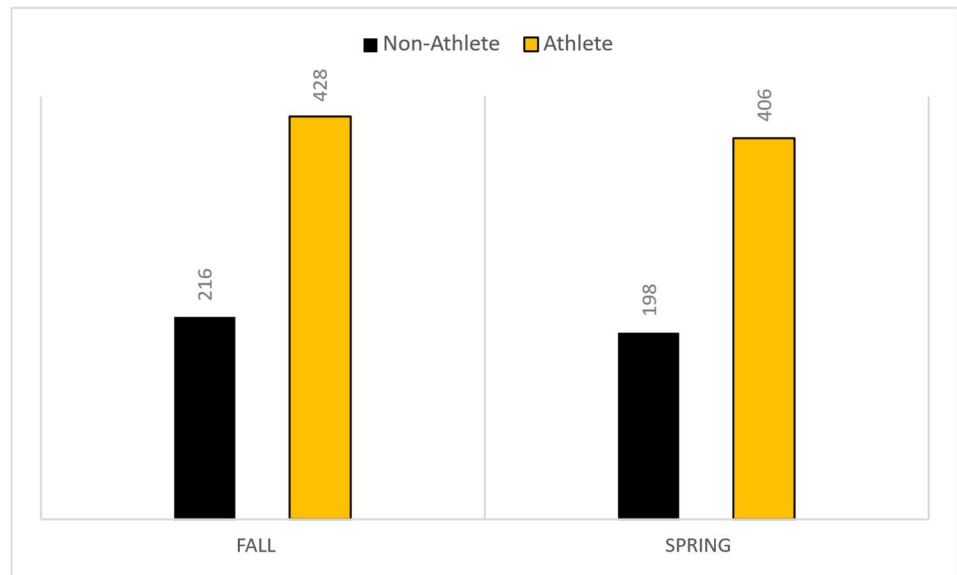
# ENROLLMENT STATISTICS – Fall & Spring 2025-2026

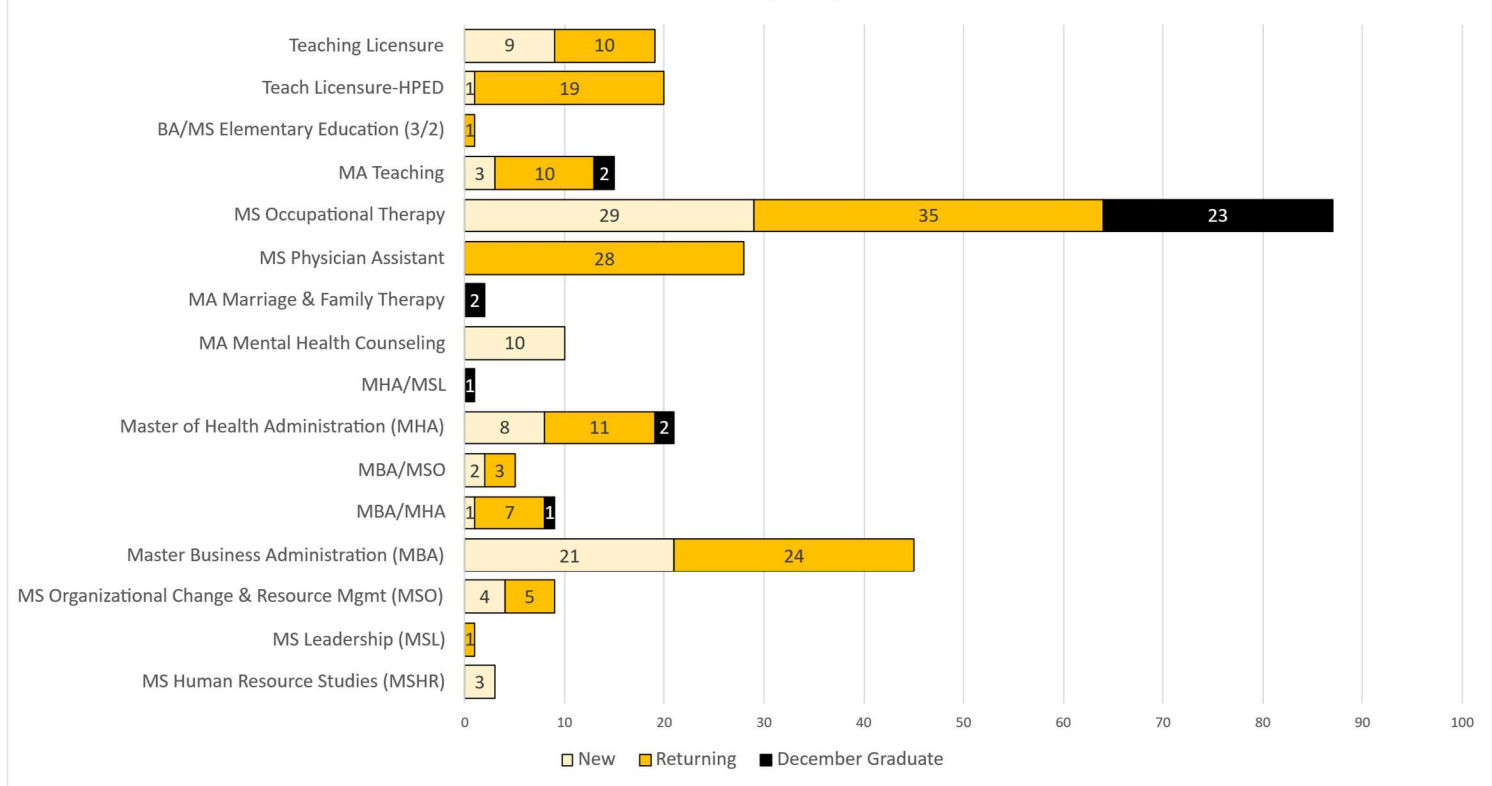
Total Enrollment - Traditional Undergraduate Only – Full Time Only



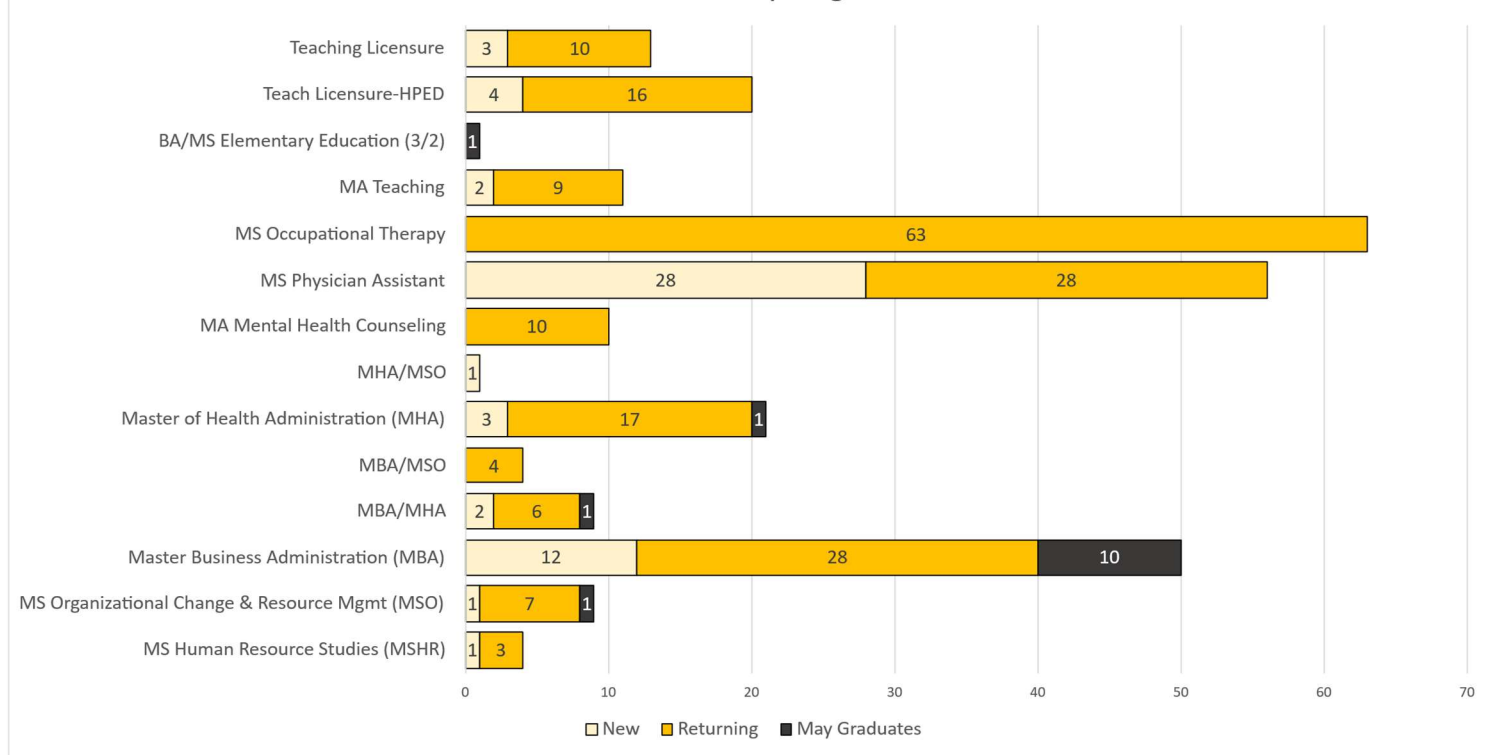

Enrollment by Program

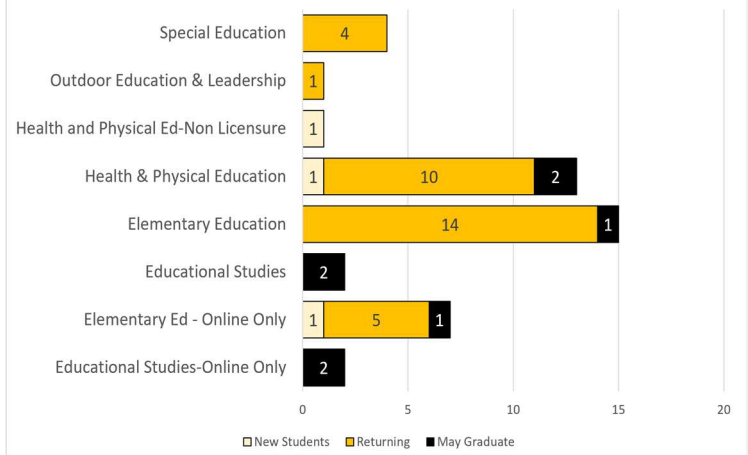

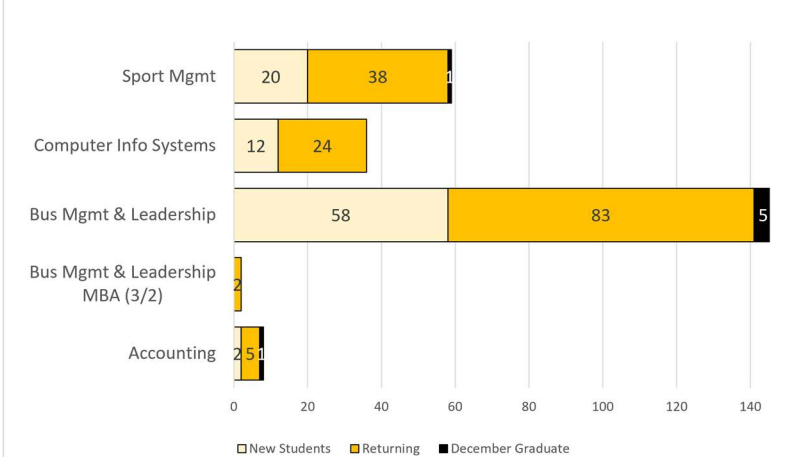
Undergraduate Fall 2025 Education Programs Enrollment



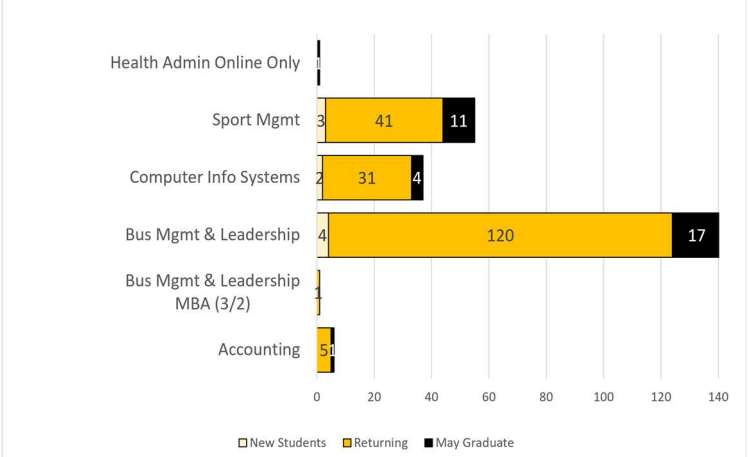
Undergraduate Spring 2026 Education Programs Enrollment



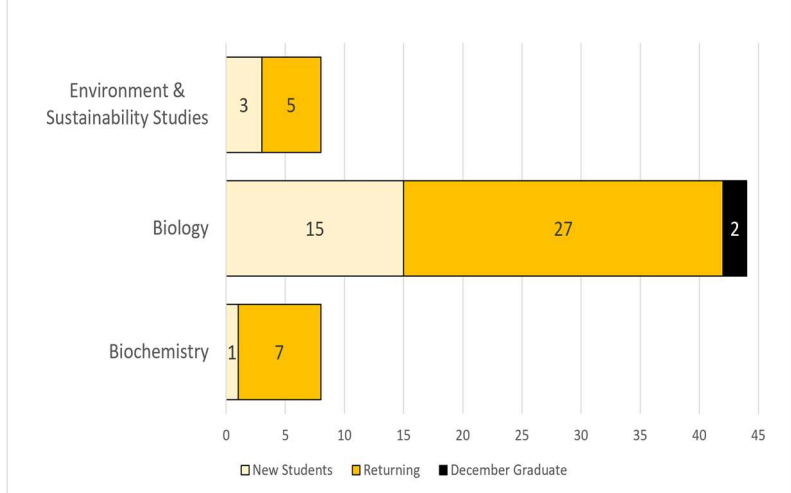
Undergraduate Fall 2025 Business Programs Enrollment



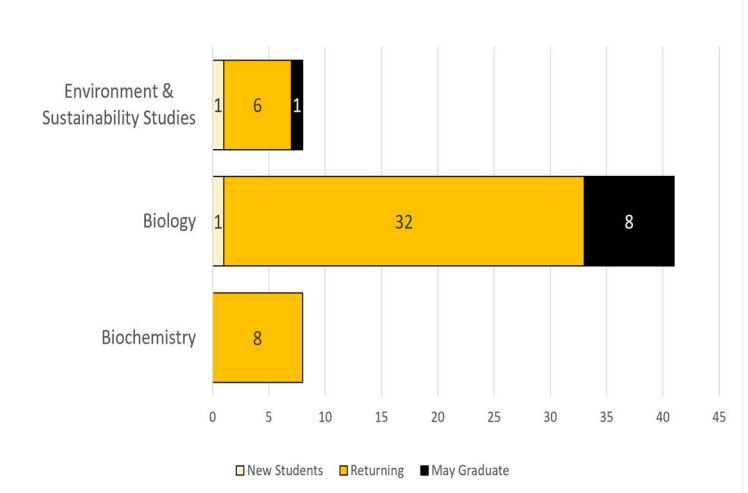
Undergraduate Spring 2026 Business Programs Enrollment



Undergraduate Fall 2025 Natural Sciences Programs Enrollment



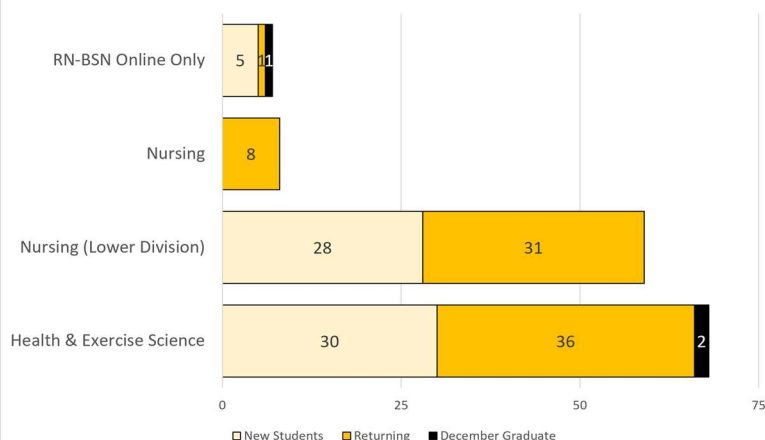

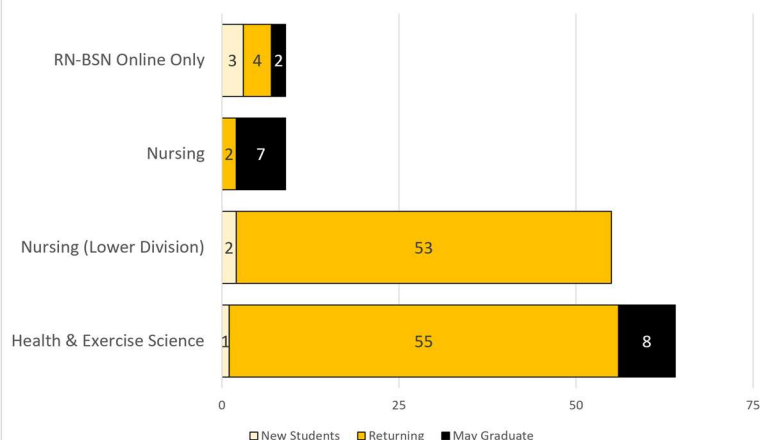

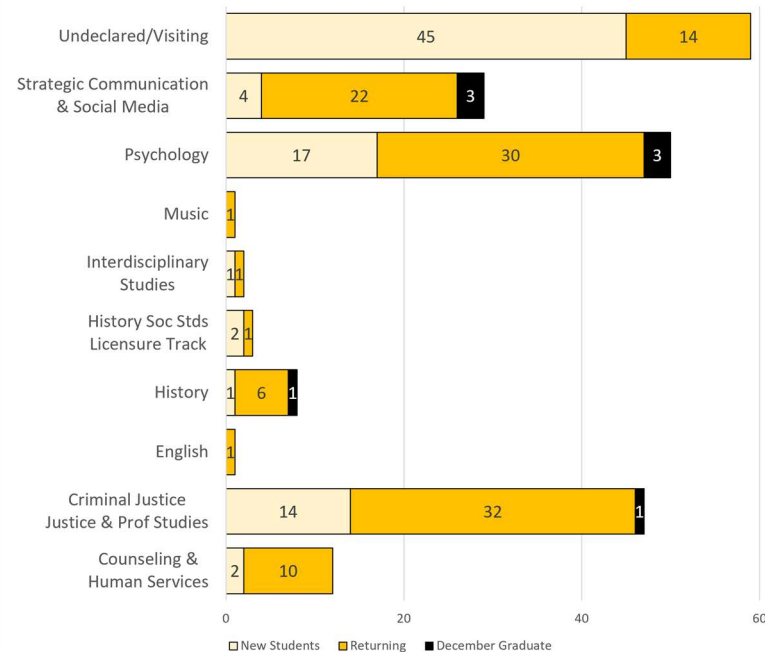
Undergraduate Fall 2025 Health Sciences Programs Enrollment



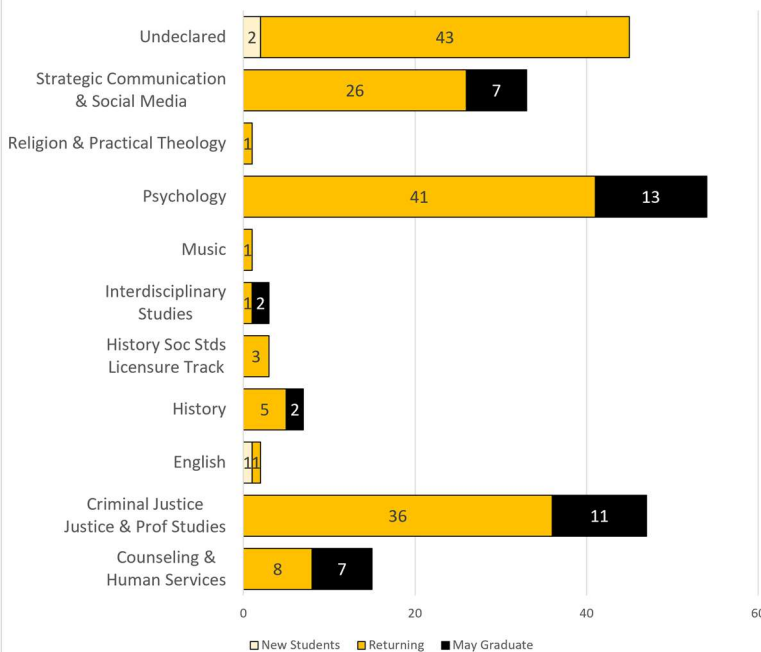
Undergraduate Spring 2026 Health Sciences Programs Enrollment

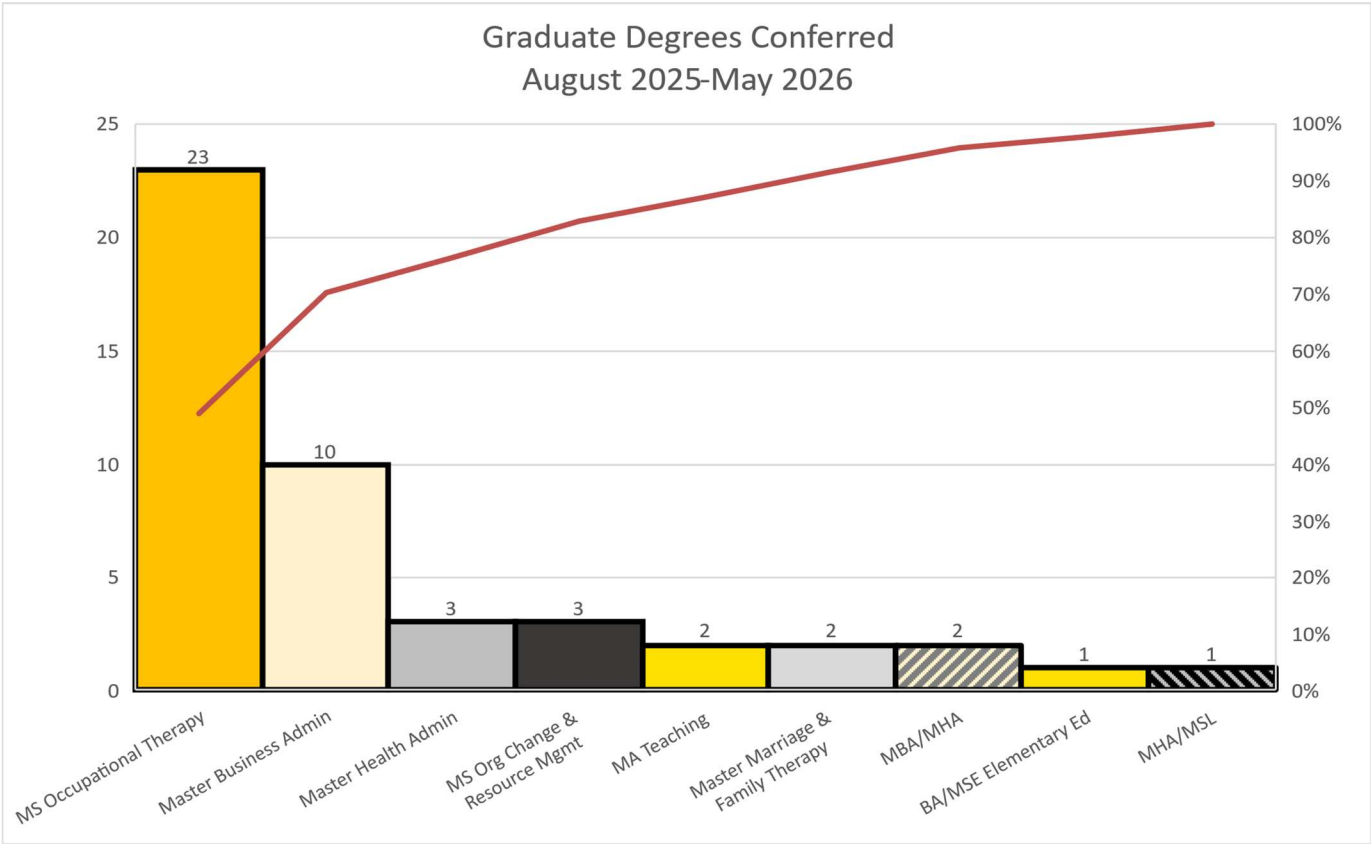
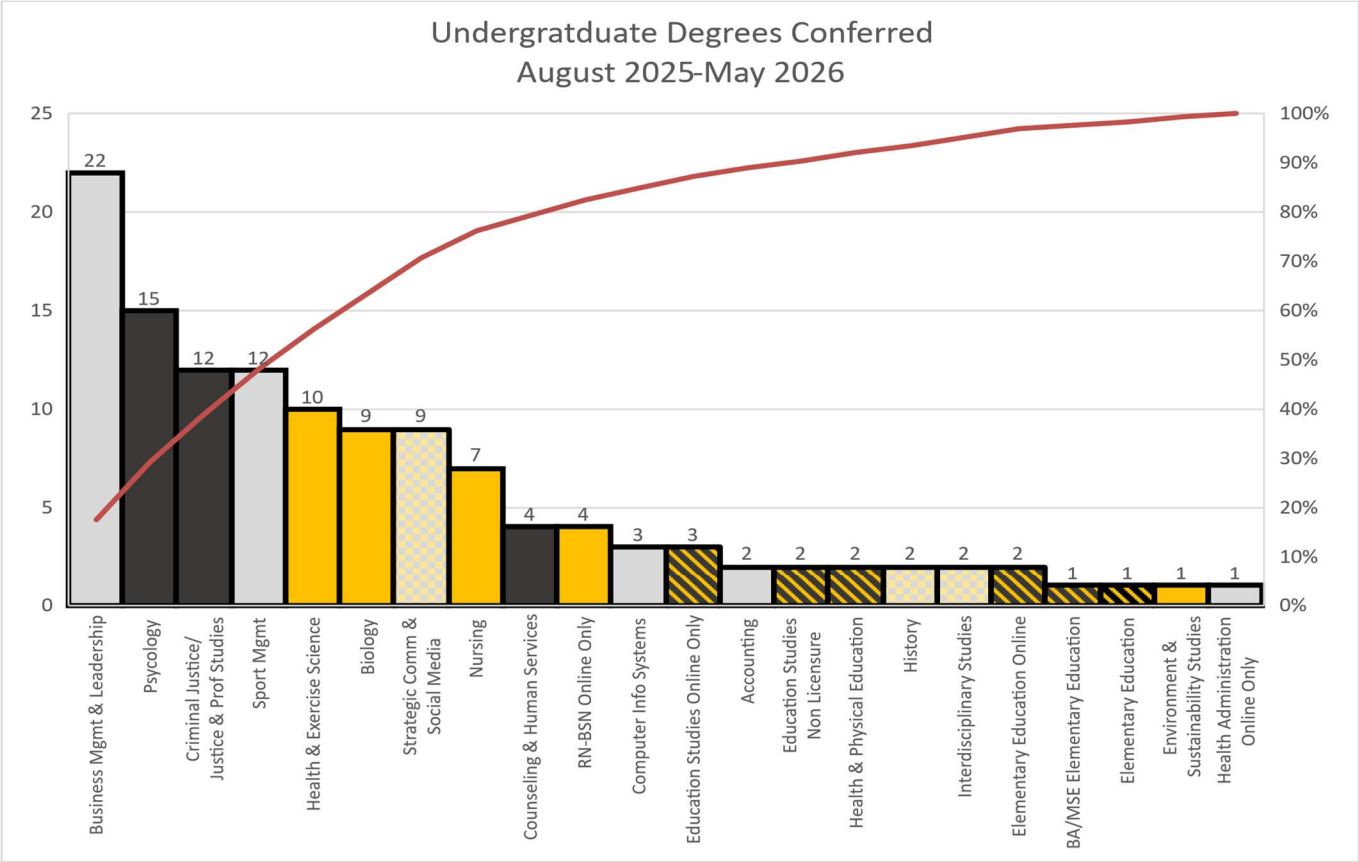

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## A Look Back

Pfeiffer University originated from the Oberlin Home and School, a homeschool developed by Miss Emily C. Prudden in 1885. In 1903, the Women's Home Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church assumed responsibility for the Oberlin property, and the Oberlin school was renamed the Ebenezer Mitchell Home and School. The Mitchell Home and School then moved to the current property in Misenheimer, issuing the first high school diplomas in 1913.

A junior college curriculum was added in 1928, and the school was renamed Mitchell Junior College. The introduction of elementary studies by county schools permitted the school to eliminate lower grades and to direct its efforts toward collegiate level work.

In honor of Henry and Annie Merner Pfeiffer of New York City, the name Pfeiffer Junior College was first used for the 1935–1936 academic year. Pfeiffer broadened its program to include senior college work in 1960. Thirty-six years later in May of 1996, the Board of Trustees voted to reorganize Pfeiffer's academic structure toward university status.

The Charlotte campus opened in 1977 with undergraduate classes in Criminal Justice, and the first graduate program followed in 1985. Additionally, the Raleigh-Durham campus opened in 2004, offering a variety of graduate programs.

Since its founding, Pfeiffer has consistently grown in academic excellence, developing new programs to meet student needs and emphasizing the ideals of Christian service.

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## Mission
